Instructions and Important Information – Please Read Carefully

- 1. The Northern Panhandle RC&D considers requests for both technical and financial assistance, from nonprofit organizations, government entities, schools, and community groups that provide benefits to the public. Requests from individuals are not accepted.
- 2. Applications for financial assistance must be submitted by January 15, 2011 to be considered for the period beginning October 1, 2011. Notification of funding approvals will be after October 19, 2011. Applications received after January 15, 2011 will be considered in the following fiscal year's funding allocation, or as funds become available.
- 3. The RC&D council will accept requests via mail, fax, or email.
- 4. Requests for financial assistance must include a dollar amount requested from the RC&D Council.
- 5. Project applications must accomplish the Objectives and Strategies of the RC&D's area plan and/or annual plan of work (available upon request). Generally speaking, the four areas of focus are:
 - Land Management
 - Land Conservation
 - Water Management
 - Community Development
- 6. Grant money will not be used for salaries. The council also discourages requests for general fund raising, staff development, or organizations that do not comply with federal civil rights policies.
- 7. Grant money will be paid to the recipient organization after the expense is incurred, on a reimbursable basis. Payment will be submitted either directly to the organization or to a 3rd party upon receipt of an invoice.
- 8. Grantees are expected to expend project funding within 1 year of notification of the award, or those funds will be made available to other projects; requests for extension may be considered if the RC&D receives sufficient documentation that the project was delayed due to uncontrollable circumstances, including weather or financial hardship.
